Key Takeaways

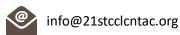
- **Proactive safety planning is critical.** It's essential for 21st CCLC programs to prioritize safety planning and apply evidence-based frameworks, such as scenario-based tabletop exercises, to enhance emergency preparedness in out-of-school time.
- **Prevention and mitigation are the first steps in emergency management.** Safety planning should ultimately address all five mission areas of emergency preparedness: prevention, mitigation (i.e., intervention), protection, response, and recovery.
- **OST programs have a key role to play in proactive safety planning.** Whether independently or as part of the larger school community, OST program staff should work collaboratively with youth, families, school leadership, and trusted community partners.
- **Resources and partnerships abound.** Many tools, strategies, and partners are available to help you address program-wide readiness. Keep attending this webinar series to discover more ways to strengthen your programs and mitigate potential threats!
